Overview


In February 2024, there were around 367,500 people employed in the Gold Coast Employment Region. The 5 largest employing industries in the region were Health Care and Social Assistance, Construction, Retail Trade, Education and Training, and Professional, Scientific and Technical Services. Together these 5 industries accounted for 56% of employment in the region.

Over the year to February 2024, employment in:

- Health Care and Social Assistance rose by 7.7% to stand at 57,300
- Construction rose by 20.2% to stand at 45,400
- Retail Trade fell by 23.3% to stand at 37,900.

In Health Care and Social Assistance in the Gold Coast Employment Region, 53% of workers were employed full-time; 75% were female; and the median age of the workforce was 43.




Employment characteristics by Industry

Which industries are youth (aged 15-24) employed in?





Which industries are mature age persons (aged 55+) employed in?




