Overview


In August 2024, there were around 2,930,600 people employed in Queensland. The 5 largest employing industries in Queensland were Health Care and Social Assistance, Retail Trade, Construction, Education and Training and Professional, Scientific and Technical Services. Together these 5 industries accounted for 51% of all employment.

Over the year to August 2024, employment in:

- Health Care and Social Assistance fell by 0.5% to stand at 452,500
- Retail Trade rose by 8.7% to stand at 293,400
- Construction rose by 0.9% to stand at 274,100.

In Health Care and Social Assistance in Queensland, 55% of workers were employed full-time; 78% were Female; and the median age of the workforce was 42. Around 50% of employed persons in this industry were located in Greater Brisbane.


Employment by industry, August 2024 and August 2023





Overview


In August 2024, there were around 570,600 people employed in the Brisbane - South East Employment Region. The 5 largest employing industries in the region were Health Care and Social Assistance, Retail Trade, Construction, Professional, Scientific and Technical Services, and Education and Training. Together these 5 industries accounted for 53% of employment in the region.

Over the year to August 2024, employment in:

- Health Care and Social Assistance fell by 3.5% to stand at 85,500
- Retail Trade rose by 28.6% to stand at 63,200
- Construction fell by 0.9% to stand at 56,400.

In Health Care and Social Assistance in the Brisbane - South East Employment Region, 56% of workers were employed full-time; 77% were female; and the median age of the workforce was 40.

Employment by industry, August 2024 and August 2023







Overview


In August 2024, there were around 145,100 people employed in the Cairns Employment Region. The 5 largest employing industries in the region were Health Care and Social Assistance, Retail Trade, Accommodation and Food Services, Public Administration and Safety, and Education and Training. Together these 5 industries accounted for 53% of employment in the region.

Over the year to August 2024, employment in:

- Health Care and Social Assistance fell by 1.2% to stand at 26,600
- Retail Trade rose by 12.3% to stand at 15,400
- Accommodation and Food Services fell by 0.5% to stand at 13,000.

In Health Care and Social Assistance in the Cairns Employment Region, 59% of workers were employed full-time; 80% were female; and the median age of the workforce was 44.

Employment by industry, August 2024 and August 2023







Overview


In August 2024, there were around 154,300 people employed in the Darling Downs Employment Region. The 5 largest employing industries in the region were Health Care and Social Assistance, Agriculture, Forestry and Fishing, Education and Training, Construction, and Manufacturing. Together these 5 industries accounted for 56% of employment in the region.

Over the year to August 2024, employment in:

- Health Care and Social Assistance rose by 10.3% to stand at 21,200
- Agriculture, Forestry and Fishing rose by 20.2% to stand at 19,800
- Education and Training rose by 9.7% to stand at 16,800.

In Health Care and Social Assistance in the Darling Downs Employment Region, 56% of workers were employed full-time; 74% were female; and the median age of the workforce was 42.

Employment by industry, August 2024 and August 2023
















Employment characteristics by Industry









Employment by industry, August 2024 and August 2023









Employment by industry, August 2024 and August 2023









Employment by industry, August 2024 and August 2023









Employment by industry, August 2024 and August 2023






