# **South Australia**

#### Overview


In August 2024, there were around 945,800 people employed in South Australia. The 5 largest employing industries in South Australia were Health Care and Social Assistance, Retail Trade, Construction, Education and Training and Manufacturing. Together these 5 industries accounted for 52% of all employment.

Over the year to August 2024, employment in:

- Health Care and Social Assistance rose by 5.8% to stand at 175,000
- Retail Trade rose by 1.4% to stand at 92,800
- Construction rose by 3.8% to stand at 81,100.


In Health Care and Social Assistance in South Australia, 53% of workers were employed full-time; 76% were Female; and the median age of the workforce was 42. Around 84% of employed persons in this industry were located in Greater Adelaide.





# Which industries are youth (aged 15-24) employed in?



### Which industries are mature age persons (aged 55+) employed in?



# **Adelaide North Employment Region**

#### Overview


In August 2024, there were around 371,200 people employed in the Adelaide North Employment Region. The 5 largest employing industries in the region were Health Care and Social Assistance, Retail Trade, Construction, Manufacturing, and Education and Training. Together these 5 industries accounted for 53% of employment in the region.

Over the year to August 2024, employment in:

- Health Care and Social Assistance rose by 6.4% to stand at 68,900
- Retail Trade fell by 2.0% to stand at 35,800
- Construction fell by 0.7% to stand at 34,600.

In Health Care and Social Assistance in the Adelaide North Employment Region, 53% of workers were employed full-time; 78% were female; and the median age of the workforce was 40.


#### Employment by industry, August 2024 and August 2023





#### Which industries are youth (aged 15-24) employed in?



#### Which industries are mature age persons (aged 55+) employed in?



#### Overview


In August 2024, there were around 386,000 people employed in the Adelaide South Employment Region. The 5 largest employing industries in the region were Health Care and Social Assistance, Professional, Scientific and Technical Services, Retail Trade, Education and Training, and Construction. Together these 5 industries accounted for 57% of employment in the region.

Over the year to August 2024, employment in:

- Health Care and Social Assistance rose by 7.1% to stand at 77,900
- Professional, Scientific and Technical Services rose by 9.0% to stand at 38,300
- Retail Trade fell by 3.5% to stand at 36,900.

In Health Care and Social Assistance in the Adelaide South Employment Region, 55% of workers were employed full-time; 73% were female; and the median age of the workforce was 43.


#### Employment by industry, August 2024 and August 2023





#### Which industries are youth (aged 15-24) employed in?



#### Which industries are mature age persons (aged 55+) employed in?



#### Overview


In August 2024, there were around 53,000 people employed in the Mid North SA Employment Region. The 5 largest employing industries in the region were Agriculture, Forestry and Fishing, Health Care and Social Assistance, Construction, Manufacturing, and Education and Training. Together these 5 industries accounted for 58% of employment in the region.

Over the year to August 2024, employment in:

- Agriculture, Forestry and Fishing rose by 10.7% to stand at 8,200
- Health Care and Social Assistance fell by 7.2% to stand at 8,200
- Construction rose by 5.9% to stand at 5,300.

In Agriculture, Forestry and Fishing in the Mid North SA Employment Region, 74% of workers were employed full-time; 71% were male; and the median age of the workforce was 52.


#### Employment by industry, August 2024 and August 2023









#### Overview


In August 2024, there were around 95,900 people employed in the Murray and South East Employment Region. The 5 largest employing industries in the region were Agriculture, Forestry and Fishing, Health Care and Social Assistance, Retail Trade, Manufacturing, and Construction. Together these 5 industries accounted for 62% of employment in the region.

Over the year to August 2024, employment in:

- Agriculture, Forestry and Fishing rose by 6.0% to stand at 17,900
- Health Care and Social Assistance fell by 4.3% to stand at 13,600
- Retail Trade rose by 26.0% to stand at 12,000.

In Agriculture, Forestry and Fishing in the Murray and South East Employment Region, 79% of workers were employed full-time; 77% were male; and the median age of the workforce was 48.


#### Employment by industry, August 2024 and August 2023







#### Which industries are mature age persons (aged 55+) employed in?





Over the year to August 2024, employment in:

- Agriculture, Forestry and Fishing rose by 42.7% to stand at 4,300.

In Health Care and Social Assistance in the North West Country SA Employment Region, 63% of workers were employed full-time; 85% were female; and the median age of the workforce was 43.


#### Employment by industry, August 2024 and August 2023







#### Which industries are mature age persons (aged 55+) employed in?


