# **Employment Region Industry profile**

# Adelaide North Employment Region

#### Overview


In August 2024, there were around 371,200 people employed in the Adelaide North Employment Region. The 5 largest employing industries in the region were Health Care and Social Assistance, Retail Trade, Construction, Manufacturing, and Education and Training. Together these 5 industries accounted for 53% of employment in the region.

Over the year to August 2024, employment in:

- Health Care and Social Assistance rose by 6.4% to stand at 68,900
- Retail Trade fell by 2.0% to stand at 35,800
- Construction fell by 0.7% to stand at 34,600.

In Health Care and Social Assistance in the Adelaide North Employment Region, 53% of workers were employed full-time; 78% were female; and the median age of the workforce was 40.




