Overview


In August 2024, there were around 184,300 people employed in the Barwon Employment Region. The 5 largest employing industries in the region were Health Care and Social Assistance, Construction, Retail Trade, Education and Training, and Manufacturing. Together these 5 industries accounted for 57% of employment in the region.

Over the year to August 2024, employment in:

- Health Care and Social Assistance rose by 6.8% to stand at 31,900
- Construction rose by 25.0% to stand at 24,000
- Retail Trade fell by 29.4% to stand at 17,900.

In Health Care and Social Assistance in the Barwon Employment Region, 54% of workers were employed part-time; 81% were female; and the median age of the workforce was 42.

Employment by industry, August 2024 and August 2023



Five largest employing industries: key statistics




Employment characteristics by Industry
