Mid North SA Employment Region

Overview


In August 2024, there were around 53,000 people employed in the Mid North SA Employment Region. The 5 largest employing industries in the region were Agriculture, Forestry and Fishing, Health Care and Social Assistance, Construction, Manufacturing, and Education and Training. Together these 5 industries accounted for 58% of employment in the region.

Over the year to August 2024, employment in:

- Agriculture, Forestry and Fishing rose by 10.7% to stand at 8,200
- Health Care and Social Assistance fell by 7.2% to stand at 8,200
- Construction rose by 5.9% to stand at 5,300.

In Agriculture, Forestry and Fishing in the Mid North SA Employment Region, 74% of workers were employed full-time; 71% were male; and the median age of the workforce was 52.


Employment characteristics by Industry
