North West Country SA Employment Region

Overview


In August 2024, there were around 39,700 people employed in the North West Country SA Employment Region. The 5 largest employing industries in the region were Health Care and Social Assistance, Retail Trade, Agriculture, Forestry and Fishing, Education and Training, and Mining. Together these 5 industries accounted for 55% of employment in the region.

Over the year to August 2024, employment in:

- Health Care and Social Assistance rose by 32.6% to stand at 6,400
- Retail Trade rose by 44.9% to stand at 4,900
- Agriculture, Forestry and Fishing rose by 42.7% to stand at 4,300.

In Health Care and Social Assistance in the North West Country SA Employment Region, 63% of workers were employed full-time; 85% were female; and the median age of the workforce was 43.




Employment characteristics by Industry
