



Employment Region Industry profile

Sydney Greater West Employment Region

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Overview


In August 2024, there were around 707,500 people employed in the Sydney Greater West Employment Region. The 5 largest employing industries in the region were Health Care and Social Assistance, Retail Trade, Construction, Professional, Scientific and Technical Services, and Manufacturing. Together these 5 industries accounted for 51% of employment in the region.

Over the year to August 2024, employment in:

- Health Care and Social Assistance rose by 4.5% to stand at 102,500
- Retail Trade rose by 5.2% to stand at 71,900
- Construction fell by 8.7% to stand at 65,200.

In Health Care and Social Assistance in the Sydney Greater West Employment Region, 62% of workers were employed full-time; 79% were female; and the median age of the workforce was 39.




Employment characteristics by Industry

Which industries are youth (aged 15-24) employed in?





Which industries are mature age persons (aged 55+) employed in?




