Overview


In August 2024, there were around 121,600 people employed in the Townsville Employment Region. The 5 largest employing industries in the region were Health Care and Social Assistance, Construction, Retail Trade, Public Administration and Safety, and Education and Training. Together these 5 industries accounted for 58% of employment in the region.

Over the year to August 2024, employment in:

- Health Care and Social Assistance rose by 18.2% to stand at 23,200
- Construction rose by 2.9% to stand at 14,000
- Retail Trade rose by 7.2% to stand at 12,100.

In Health Care and Social Assistance in the Townsville Employment Region, 61% of workers were employed full-time; 77% were female; and the median age of the workforce was 41.

Employment by industry, August 2024 and August 2023




Five largest employing industries: key statistics


Employment characteristics by Industry
