Wimmera/Mallee Employment Region

Overview


In August 2024, there were around 78,900 people employed in the Wimmera/Mallee Employment Region. The 5 largest employing industries in the region were Agriculture, Forestry and Fishing, Health Care and Social Assistance, Construction, Retail Trade, and Education and Training. Together these 5 industries accounted for 65% of employment in the region.

Over the year to August 2024, employment in:

- Agriculture, Forestry and Fishing rose by 17.4% to stand at 13,500
- Health Care and Social Assistance fell by 16.0% to stand at 11,600
- Construction rose by 21.9% to stand at 9,000.

In Agriculture, Forestry and Fishing in the Wimmera/Mallee Employment Region, 81% of workers were employed full-time; 69% were male; and the median age of the workforce was 49.




Employment characteristics by Industry
