Overview


In August 2024, there were around 310,300 people employed in the Wivenhoe Employment Region. The 5 largest employing industries in the region were Health Care and Social Assistance, Retail Trade, Education and Training, Public Administration and Safety, and Professional, Scientific and Technical Services. Together these 5 industries accounted for 54% of employment in the region.

Over the year to August 2024, employment in:

- Health Care and Social Assistance rose by 3.0% to stand at 48,400
- Retail Trade rose by 21.1% to stand at 31,200
- Education and Training rose by 0.9% to stand at 30,300.

In Health Care and Social Assistance in the Wivenhoe Employment Region, 60% of workers were employed full-time; 79% were female; and the median age of the workforce was 41.




Employment characteristics by Industry
