



# **Jobs and Skills Atlas**

#### Overview

• The Jobs and Skills Atlas (Atlas) is an interactive data tool designed to provide comprehensive insights into the Australian labour market at national, state, and regional levels. This free public tool integrates labour market, skills, and training data into a user-friendly platform.

## **Key Features**

- **Interactive Regional Map:** Easily navigate and find information by region, occupation, industry or training.
- Detailed Data: Access demographic and labour market data broken down by regions.
- **Comparative Analysis:** Compare regional labour markets with state or national data.
- Occupation and Industry Insights: Identify occupations on the shortage list, 'clean energy' occupations, industry characteristics and business entries and exits.
- Training Data: View training completions by courses and cohort breakdowns.

#### **Benefits**

- User-Friendly: Simple platform for accessing complex data.
- Comprehensive: Covers various aspects of the labour market.
- Informative: Helps users understand labour market trends and training needs.

#### **Data Sources**

Atlas uses data from various sources, including:

- Jobs and Skills Australia (JSA): Internet Vacancy Index (IVI), Nowcasting of Employment by Region, Occupation (NERO) and Occupation Shortage List (OSL).
- Australian Bureau of Statistics (ABS).
- National Centre for Vocational Education Research (NCVER).
- Australian Business Registry (ABR).

#### **Features**

New data sources and features are added to the Atlas based on stakeholder and user feedback. Current features include:

- Clean Energy Occupations: Filter by clean energy occupations.
- VET National Data Asset (VNDA): Student outcomes data.
- Occupations Tab: Includes Occupation Shortage List and skills shortage drivers.
- Industry Tab: Employment Projections and Business entries and exits
- Training Tab: Filter by training package and occupation.
- Training Enrolments Data: By courses and cohorts.
- Alternative Data Views: Through Occupation and Industry lenses.
- Wage and Salary Data: Linked to Occupations and Industry pages.
- Additional Resources: Methodology, User guide, Q&As, Quick links and 'What's New' section.

### **Stakeholder Consultation**

Ongoing consultation with stakeholders is crucial to the development of the Atlas. This includes:

- Presentations to individuals, agencies, organisations and working groups.
- Consultations: Formal and informal, with a range of users.
- Feedback: Via the JSA website, user testing and Google Analytics data.
